WHY IS MOVEMENT
IMPORTANT?

ACCORDING TO A GROWING BODY OF RESEARCH, INCLUDING A [2017 STUDY FROM DUKE UNIVERSITY](#), STUDENTS NEED MOVEMENT TO INCREASE CONCENTRATION, WHICH IS ONE OF THE BIGGEST INDICATORS OF SUCCESS IN STUDENTS.

ACCORDING TO [EDWEEK.ORG](#), "MOVEMENT INCREASES BLOOD AND OXYGEN FLOW, WHICH POSITIVELY AFFECTS COGNITIVE DEVELOPMENT, PHYSICAL HEALTH, AND MENTAL WELL-BEING."

WITH THE NUMBER OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION PROGRAMS BEING CUT, IT IS NECESSARY FOR CLASSROOM TEACHERS TO INCORPORATE MOVEMENT INTO THEIR LESSONS.

COLLABORATION IN THE CLASSROOM IS A KEY PART OF LEARNING. STUDENTS NEED TO LEARN TO COMMUNICATE IDEAS WITH THEIR PEERS.

IT IS A WELL-KNOWN FACT THAT THE END PRODUCT OF MASTERY IS BEING ABLE TO TEACH THE CONTENT YOURSELF.

NOT ONLY DOES COLLABORATION ALLOW STUDENTS TO PROCESS INFORMATION AND DEVELOP COMMUNICATION SKILLS, BUT INCREASES STUDENT UNDERSTANDING AND MASTERY AS STUDENTS TEACH EACH OTHER CONTENT.

WE HAVE ALL BEEN TRAINED IN KAGAN STRUCTURES, BUT NOT EVERYONE USES THEM DAILY!

ADDING A MOVEMENT-BASED KAGAN STRUCTURE TO YOUR LESSONS WILL INCREASE ENGAGEMENT AND LEARNING IN YOUR CLASSROOM.

Timed Pair Share



- 1) Teacher prompts with topic or question
- 2) Students think about the question
- 3) In pairs, Partner A shares, B listens
- 4) Partner B responds with positive gambit
- 5) Partners switch roles

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THIS IS A GREAT WAY FOR STUDENTS TO
DISCUSS AND SYNTHESIZE WHAT THEY'VE
LEARNED!

LET'S ADD A LAYER:
HAND UP STAND UP PAIR UP
MOVEMENT IS JUST AS
IMPORTANT AS
COLLABORATION!

Stand Up, Hand Up, Pair Up

- 1) Teacher says go (stand up, hand up, pair up)
- 2) Students keep hand in air until they find the partner closest to them (HIGH FIVE)
- 3) Teacher prompts with topic or question
- 4) Students think about prompt
- 5) Partners take turns sharing



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THIS CAN BE USED AT ANY TIME TO GET STUDENTS UP AND MOVING WHEN THEY AREN'T FEELING MOTIVATED!

QUIZ QUIZ TRADE: A GREAT WAY BLEND OF INFORMATION AND MOVEMENT!

Quiz-Quiz-Trade

- 1) Stand up, hand up, pair up
- 2) Partner A quizzes partner B
- 3) Partner B answers
- 4) Partner A praises or coaches
- 5) Partners switch roles
- 6) Partners trade cards and thank each other
- 7) Repeat at own pace

Rally Coach



- 1) Partner A solves the first problem (verbal & written).
- 2) Partner B watches and listens, checking and coaching as needed.
- 3) Partner B solves the next problem (verbal & written).
- 4) Partner A watches and listens, checking and coaching as needed.
- 5) Partners continue until all problems complete or time is up.
